

Ah August. School is back in session and we begin looking forward to the fall and cooler temperatures. The 8th month of year was originally called "Sextillis", as it was in the year 753 BC the 6th month, but in 700 BC the two months of January and February were added to the calendar year, causing August to be the 8th month. It was renamed "August" in 14 BC to honor the Roman Emperor, Caesar Augustus, or Octavian. Octavian picked this month because this was the month when he won nearly all his important battles with the capture of Egypt and death of Cleopatra being his most consequential victory, giving Rome the ancient kingdom of Egypt. It is also the month Augustus would die in — the 19th of August. August is also the 80th anniversary of America dropping the Atomic Bomb on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, heralding a new age in warfare. The bomb probably saved tens of millions of lives as an invasion of the Japanese homeland might. For 80 years we have been able to keep a nuclear peace thru mutual assured destruction and the signing of arms control treaties. Yet today we are watching as nation after nation seeks to learn how to split the atom. We perhaps live in a more dangerous age than at any time during the Cold War. The Japanese have two memorials to these catastrophic events. A reminder of the horrifying destruction the atomic bomb unleashed. In 79 AD Mount Vesuvius erupts burying the town of Pompeii beneath

tons of ash — it would be until the 1800s when it would be uncovered again. For the Romans and early Christians this was the worst natural disaster that could be imagined, and it would provide lots of imagery for the Bibles' apocalyptic imagery — mountains crumbling into the sea, sun and moon refusing to shine, the earth trembling, people disappearing. And for you ladies, the 19th Amendment passed 105 years ago on the 18th, giving your the right to vote. On the 2nd, Wild Bill Hickok was killed during a poker game; he was holding the dead man's hand. Do you know what it was?
