

Our support group for Widow(er)s meets at the church library at **Noon** on the **first** and third Wednesdays of each month. Join us as we gather to share experiences and support each other on this journey. All are welcome. If you know a widow(er), let them know about our group.

A support group for people with Parkinson's and their Caregivers meets the **first Wednesday** of each month in the church library at **10 am**. This is open to anyone in the community!

Bible Study Wednesdays 6 pm in the church library. We use Dr. David Brakke's <u>Great Courses Lectures</u> for the first 30 minutes and then use study questions to start a discussion. These lectures take us thru the books of the New Testament.

Mobile Food Pantry church parking lot the **2nd and 4th Wednesdays of each month**. Cars start lining up at 8:45 AM and we distribute until the food runs out, typically within an hour. If you are homebound and do not have a friend or neighbor who can pick up for you, call the church <u>by Noon on Mondays</u> to be added to our very <u>limited</u> delivery schedule.

Widow(ers) Group meet the first and third Wednesdays of each month from Noon - 1 PM in the church library. Occasionally, they plan a luncheon outing. If you grieve, you don't have to grieve alone. This is such a loving, encouraging, and supportive group of people. You will feel welcome and cared for.
