Yikes, **LENT** is just over a week away! We will be holding an Ash Wednesday Observance on the 18th of February at 6 PM. This is a service of repentance and ashes, and is a very special moment in the life of our faith community. Lent officially begins after the service. As we prepare for the Lenten season, now is the time to start considering your Lenten sacrifices. The possibilities are endless — fasting on certain days, giving up something you think you can live without (forget Dry January, try 40 days of no drinking). Maybe consider “taking-up” some new habit like daily Bible reading, a time of prayer, or volunteering to serve. Remember, it is called “Sundays in Lent” not “of Lent”, as Sundays are never to be designated fast days because they are always moments of celebration (which is why there are 40 days, not 46 days of Lent). I’ll have a set of daily devotions for Lent that will be posted on social media. I will also post a copy on the website that you may download, or just ask me, and I’ll give you a copy. Part of our Lenten worship will include what is called a “Tenebrae Ritual”, the extinguishing of candles to mark the days. We’ll do this as we enter into Communion time, the traditional moment when we confess our sins before coming to the table. Don’t worry, this will be corporate in nature, so no personal confessions please. Easter will be early this year, the first week in April, so plan to set aside Maundy Thursday and Good Friday as we will have special worship services for each of those holy days. The choir is

frantically getting their cantata together, as they don’t have a lot of time this year to prepare. Of course their music is always inspiring and uplifting so I doubt they will have any trouble at all. Our sermon series for Lent is called, “**The 7 Last Words of Christ**”, each one being a certain biblical theme we would do well to keep in our hearts in times of trial and tribulation and we feel like we have no hope. Thank you to all who volunteered for the warming shelter. We were able to give shelter to a lady who had lost her apartment just as the snow began to fall. We couldn’t help people in need without you.

Widow(er)s Support Group

Our support group for Widow(er)s meets at the church library at **Noon** on the **first and third Wednesdays** of each month. If you grieve, you don't have to grieve alone. This is such a loving, encouraging, and supportive group of people. You will feel welcome and cared for. There are occasional luncheon outings, particularly on the 5th Wednesdays of months.
