

Today is Pentecost Sunday, the fiftieth day after Easter and the fulfillment of Jesus' promise that he would not leave us orphaned, but that the Holy Spirit would come to remind us and teach us everything. This day is also known as Whitsunday, an old English term referring to the color of white, for the last day of Eastertide. Our symbols are fire, wind, and the dove, and the color is red (I hope you will wear something red this day). This is the day the Holy Spirit descended upon the followers of Jesus like a dove, and tongues of fire rested upon their heads. It was a moment of transformation, as frightened disciples became bold proclaimers and doers of the Word. Much of the Pentecost story comes from the book of Acts, but there are echos of other stories. Perhaps the most familiar is the valley of dry bones in the book of Ezekiel. As Israel lay defeated, their hopes crushed, their future all but destroyed, God asks the prophet, "Can these bones live?" It is a beautiful and surreal moment in the Bible, as life triumphs over death and Israel is promised they have not been abandoned. The gift of the Spirit united people from all races, and this is a profound bit of



teaching we should really take more seriously. In Christ there is no longer divisions between Jew and Greek, male and female, slave and free — and that goes for all the other tribal divisions we use to exclude others. June is Pride Month, and next weekend we are going to be present to the LGBTQ community to overcome the prejudice that has too often been shown against them. We have a booth downtown and a parade to walk in, if you can be a part of any of that please consider signing up. In a world of divisions we must show the love of Christ and overcome all that separates us.
