


Now, I have been harping on reading the Gospel of Mark as a single, literary creation, ignoring chapter and verse and experiencing the work as the early Christians would have. Cutting and pasting different verses from different books of the Bible just creates a theological monstrosity that the authors of the Bible would find horrifying. However, it is a neat exercise to compare the Gospels. Matthew and Luke were written after Mark's Gospel and both contain word for word passages they copied from Mark (which is why we know Mark was first). Of course John is so unique that his material hardly derives anything from the other three besides the Passion and Resurrection and the feeding of the multitudes. Our passage today concerns the healing of two daughters, and this story is found in Matthew and Luke too. Except in Matthew the writer wants to emphasize that Jairus' daughter is dead, not just sick. In Mark, Jairus' daughter is sick at the beginning and is dead at the end. I've had literalists tell me there must have been two different people named Jairus and a daughter who is sick and dying. That's pretty ludicrous. I guess Matthew changes the story to emphasize there is not mistaking the fact the daughter was dead and not just sleeping. In Mark, Jesus is confused when the woman touches him, but in Matthew Jesus is fully aware of everything. Matthew removes the Aramaic phrase, "Talitha cumi", because that

writer doesn't like the idea Jesus needs special words to heal. In Matthew there is no command to keep this a secret, everyone proclaims it far and near. In Matthew the little girl's father is simply a leader and has no name. In Mark (and Luke), he is the leader of a synagogue and his name is Jairus, which can mean, "to awaken" (nice touch Mark, because the little girl awakens). Of course there is much, much more to this story that we will cover on Sunday. Yet, when reading the Gospels compare the stories, ask why one says this and the other changes it. Such questions will open you eyes to all sorts of new insights.
