Our support group for Widow(er)s meets at the church library at **Noon** on the **first and third Wednesdays** of each month. Join us as we gather to share experiences and support each other on this journey. All are welcome. If you know a widow(er), let them know about our group.

A support group for people with Parkinson's and their Caregivers meets the **first Wednesday** of each month in the church library at **10 am**. This is open to anyone in the community!

We are so blessed to have faithful supporters and mentors that partner with us in our homeless/shower ministry. Harold's Diner has donated tokens that we can distribute to a homeless person which can be turned in for a free nutritious meal. Some of our donors &/or church members have expressed that you would love the opportunity to sit down in a safe environment with one of our clients, share a meal and conversation. If that sounds like you, call the church office and I can facilitate an opportunity for you to take a client to Harolds Diner for a meal and conversation, using the token for the homeless meal. If you haven't been to Harold's Diner (17 White Street) you are in for a treat! Their menu is creative, healthy and delicious. Plus, they have a record collection which you can select from and play on their record player.

Reflection These words were shared in a class during the Mission U "Welcome Home" study. What is home for you?

Lights on bright, a nice, trimmed lawn, Laughter and...people inside – this must be the place! Quietly entering, no one notices. Not one hello. This isn't it. No, it's not the one. I must go. Down the road, looking, searching ~ Tired, lonely, sad, disappointed... Then, a clearing in the woods ahead!

Light filters in, no walls, an open place. A true calm, breathing space...

YOU appear with arms open wide, smiling, welcoming me. Yes, this it. I'm home!

Shower/Laundry & Homeless Ministry Requested Items	Our church showers are open to men and women so they can freshen up, do a load of laundry, and be ready for a job interview, medical appointment, or just a chance to be clean. Showers are available Monday thru Thursday from 9 AM till 1:30 PM . Pantry Current needs: Food staples, ingredients to make nutrient-dense meals; refried beans, peanut butter & crackers, granola-type bars (the soft kind because they often have dental issues), men & women sturdy sneakers/hiking boots.
