Baptism

of the Lord Sunday

At Baptism God places a song in your heart. And this is the song: Heaven is open to you; God's Spirit is in you; you mean everything to God. You are music to God's heart, and God will never forget your song. And we, who love you, promise to learn the song so well that we can sing it back to you when you forget how it goes.

A Joyful Community of Faith, loving God by serving all people including the least, the last, and the lost.

We celebrate today the Baptism of our Lord. Interestingly, there are differences in the four gospels as to this story. Who actually baptized Jesus? Matthew and Mark tell us it was John. Luke is a bit hesitant to talk about it, only implying John did. The Gospel of John doesn't mention the actual baptism. In Matthew God's voice is heard by all, in Mark and Luke only Jesus hears it. In John's Gospel, John the Baptist talks about seeing Jesus baptized but never narrates the story of his baptism. Mark wants to make baptism the start of Jesus' ministry. Luke uses it to highlight his prayer and humanity. Matthew's baptism reveals Jesus as king and messiah, and John, though never mentioning it, emphasizes Jesus' divine nature as part of John the

Baptist's testimony. Nowhere in the gospels are we told the disciples were ever baptized by Jesus. In fact, Jesus never baptizes anyone. Paul, our earliest Christian writer, talks a lot about baptism — dying and rising with Christ, a new nature, being transformed. He even tells us he kept no record of who he baptized, because those Corinthians ranked themselves in importance by who baptized them (apparently being baptized by Apollos was the gold standard, Paul just says it doesn't really matter). Baptism eventually became a sacrament and an initiation into the church. Easter morning was the most popular day for baptisms. In the early days of the church, it was done in the nude, and when you came up out of the water

you were given new white clothes, symbolizing the new life and identity in Christ. Thank goodness we can let go of some traditions, but that is another hint that women played significant leadership roles as no male would have been allowed to baptize a naked female initiate. As United Methodists we believe Baptism is an outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace. It's not the amount of water that saves, but the grace of God. May we all remember our Baptism this day and recommit ourselves to the work of Christ.

Widow(er)s Support Group

Our support group for Widow(er)s meets at the church library at **Noon** on the **first and third Wednesdays** of each month. If you grieve, you don't have to grieve alone. This is such a loving, encouraging, and supportive group of people. You will feel welcome and cared for. There are occasional luncheon outings, particularly on the 5th Wednesdays of months.

Shower & Laundry Ministry

Church Warming Center

We will be operating our warming shelter for women and children when the temperature is 9 degrees or below. Clients can check in from 4:30 PM-8:00 PM, when the doors will be locked.
