

News from Eureka Springs United Methodist Church The Leadership Team has been exploring the possibility of creating a Columbarium here on our church property, inside of the Prayer Garden that forms an island in our parking lot. St. Elizabeth's Catholic Church purchased one for \$27,000 three years ago. It has 24 niches that can hold two urns in every niche. The way this works is as follows: families can purchase a niche for \$1,800 to place cremated remains of loved ones. Two urns can be fitted in each niche. Families can then add a plaque. If you decide to later move the remains, you may sell the niche back to the church at a discounted rate. Going forward, we would like to know everyone's opinion on this. opportunity to experience totality. It is hard to describe the experience, but it is so very moving and awe-inspiring; just a wonderful expression of God's creation. The next eclipse that will pass over our area will be in 2045. It is unfortunate that some people use these events to scare others into accepting their theologies. Predictions of the end of time and the rapture made their way across social media, and even now, having been proven wrong, they are recalculating and claiming it will happen on April 23rd. America has proven to be a fertile ground for these rapture nuts. Rapture is not found in the Bible, but is an invention of James Nelson Darby who lived from 1800 to 1885. He read the Bible and collected various verses of the Bible and created the Rapture. Many Christians ever since have used his teachings to try and show that this date or that date would be the end of time. In my lifetime I think I have experienced a good two dozen of these events, and yet, they still garner attention and money when these predictions are made. It is time we stop listening to them and their false prophecies. The world doesn't need a gospel of fear, but one of hope. We are not called to be 'Chicken Littles' crying, 'the sky is falling.' We are Jesus followers, proclaiming the message of hope and love.

General Conference 2024	The General Conference will meet between April 23rd and May 3rd in Charlottesville North Carolina.
