## *Transfiguration Sunday*

15th of February 2026

Hopefully you remembered your sweetheart yesterday? Saint Valentine's Day? This is a busy few days of celebrations — Valentine's Day, Transfiguration Sunday, Fat Tuesday, and yes, Ash Wednesday. Valentine's day is well known, established to honor a saint who ended his letters to the people he loved with, "from your Valentine." Transfiguration Sunday honors the moment Jesus took three of his disciples up to the mountaintop to be transformed into light. Peter wants to take selfies and stay there forever, but God tells them to leave and get busy doing what Jesus tells them to do. Fat Tuesday is the last day to clean out the pantry to get rid of all the food you might be fasting from — that became a day to indulge and to party. Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent, the 40 days of fasting, prayer, and self-discipline as we get our hearts ready for Holy Week and Easter. Our Lenten sermon series is on the seven last words of Christ taken from the four different gospels. We will look at what these words mean, and what the gospel writers are trying to teach us thru them. Each of the last words reflect different scriptural traditions and commands of Jesus. We'll be adding a Lenten liturgy to help focus our hearts and minds. Pam Steinke will be writing devotionals to start our service as we begin each Sunday by extinguishing one of the seven candles of Lent — a way to mark our time. There will be a special "Call to Confession" as we enter into the Communion liturgy. I have finally recovered from COVID. Please be careful, tis the season for flu, COVID, and all the other mystery ailments we catch. We are asking for folks who might be interested in deepening their discipleship by signing up for the Lay Servant Course being offered at our church in April. This is a wonderful opportunity to learn how we can build up our church, how we can serve, and how we can be faithful followers of Christ. Talk to Janet Arnett or Jay Parker to learn more, but I strongly encourage you to consider taking this day-long course.
