


Next Sunday evening at 5 PM we are starting up our Theology on Tap series discussing the problem of poverty and how we do not understand it. Many have been reading the book, "The Invisible Child" by Andrea Elliot to prepare, but it is not necessary to have read it to participate (it's a very difficult book to get thru). We all make assumptions (and judgements) about people in poverty, but the problem is far more complex than what we think. As one person commented, "It costs a fortune to be poor." What we could consider a minor annoyance — like a flat tire — can be an impossible hurdle for those in poverty. If you can't afford to fix a tire, you can't make it to work, and if you can't make it to work you lose your income. Traffic tickets annoy us, but for a poor person it means their monthly income was just wiped out and now they cannot pay rent and are homeless. Government assistance comes with so much red tape many just give up. Homelessness is dramatically increasing in our nation, as is food insecurity. Healthcare is beyond the reach of so many. As a church we are a mission to those in poverty. We are providing food, laundry, and showers (and



sometimes rental and utility assistance if the situation is dire). We also have a church car to take people to doctor and dental appointments. It's hard to distinguish between real need and those just looking for a freebie, but the real problem is getting people to understand the language of poverty. I hope you can attend next Sunday's Theology on Tap as we struggle to understand it and hopefully come away knowing a little bit more about tackling it. Theology on Tap is cosponsored by Gotahold Brewing, and that's where we will be gathering for an evening of conversation.
