


We are approaching the final few weeks of the year. Thanksgiving is this week and then it will be Advent and Christmas. Please remember the church in your end of year giving. We are behind in our budget and yet doing so, so much. Remember that your end-of-year withdrawals from retirement may be given to the church as a tax deductible gift. Our missions and ministries are dependent on your gifts and they allow us to do so much throughout the year. We have recently adopted an Al-Anon Group that is meeting on Tuesday and Thursdays. We sponsor a Widow(er)s Support group that meets twice a month that serves so many in our community. We host a Parkinsons' Support Group once a month and a Care-Givers Support Group.



We are working with the Northwest Arkansas Food Pantry to do a Mobile Pantry twice a month that serves over 600 families in need. Your gifts help pay all these bills that keep these groups functioning. We have a wonderful music ministry along with the Jubilee Ringers. We have a digital community of faith that is being served through our livestream, which requires multiple media platforms. On Sunday mornings before church we host a fellowship gathering. We are a very active church, and we have done so much for our community over the last few years, all in thanks to your faithful generosity thru the gifts that you give. We are grateful! Christ the King Sunday is next week, the end of the Christian Year. We will then be in Advent as we prepare for Christmas and the birth of Jesus. The Choir will be doing their Christmas Cantata on the 17th of December during the worship service. Our Blue Christmas Service — the Liturgy of the Longest Night — is

offered for those who need a more somber and reflective service as they navigate grief and loss. We will have a wonderful cellist playing "Hallelujah" and "Silent Night". So come and be a part of this beautiful and moving service. Christmas Eve is on a Sunday this year, so we will have our regular Sunday morning service (the 4th Sunday in Advent), and that evening at 5:30 will be our Candlelight and Communion Service. Whew! After that it will be the New Year as we welcome the year 2024. As we enter Advent we leave the Old Testament behind us and begin our journey thru the Gospels, especially the infancy narratives that can teach us so much about Jesus and the mission of the early church. I hope you have enjoyed our sojourn thru the Old Testament; there are lots of stories we missed but I hope it inspired you to read and study a little more. This week is Thanksgiving, so I wish you safe travels and sacred times with your families and friends.
