# 20th of July 2025

Today we start our Summer Sermon Series, a study of Mark's Gospel verse by verse. Here are some important things to keep in mind. "Mark" was written in the 1st Century AD at a time when only 3% of the population could read, and even less could actually write. "Mark" would not have been read by individuals but performed orally, thru dramatic reading by an expert. It would take just under two hours to read Mark's Gospel aloud, and this is how the vast majority of the early Christians would have heard the gospel — all at once! It would not have been cut up not chapter and verses and those passages individually read (we must wait a thousand years before someone came up with the idea of adding those divisions). "Mark" was written in the '60s AD, a decade of great turmoil and change. The disciples are dying as are anyone who had known Jesus. Peter and Paul would be executed by the Emperor Nero. Jerusalem and its Temple are destroyed by the Legions, leaving behind only two Jewish groups — the Pharisees and the Jesus followers. Both will have to define their faith in new ways. One will become the followers of Judaism, and the other will become Christians. We do not know who wrote "Mark", and the title itself appears no where in the writing, and neither does the author identify himself (or herself). It is the first gospel to be written. It is the shortest as well. "Mark" does not go into a lot of details, so pay close attention to the details

the writer does add, for they speak volumes. In the story of the fishes and loaves, the writer emphasizes that the people were in a desert place. Then when Jesus breaks bread and tells them to sit down, they sit on the green grass. The Old Testament prophets had promised that when God's kingdom would appear the deserts would bloom. These are the little details to pay attention to in Mark's Gospel. So, bring your bibles, bring a notebook, and a pencil or pen and let's experience this wonderful tale the way the early church would have first experienced it — as one continuous story!
