

(A Christmas Letter From Rev. Doctor Richard Brooks:) For many years at Christmas I have written a letter with a personal note to each family as I know you. This year is a little different as I just don't see as well and my fingers don't type or write like they used to. My granddaughter has been helping me with all of my correspondence so I have asked her to help me with the letters this year, thus the reason for no personal note at the bottom of the letter......How do you say in a letter all of what Christmas means? Each of us has to decide what is important and by what standards to live. Christmas gives us a great perspective of how much difference one many can make. From Jesus' birth, childhood, death, and resurrection there are many lessons. We decide how much meaning this is given in our lives and what kind of person we want to be. I grew up close to grandparents, uncles, aunts, and cousins. The family was a mixture of migrant offspring from Scotland, Germany, England, and Ireland. The family standard was set by my Scottish grandparents consisting of large family gatherings at Christmas. Even Sunday dinners drew a crowd of 15 at times. This went on from as early as I can remember to 1936 when 3 of my grandparents passed away. During these years, and through the great depression, we at times had to live with grandparents, and they in turn had to live with us. These were difficult times financially but looking back, there were no better memories than all of us being together. Church is what comes closest to that feeling for me; gathering with family, friends, and neighbors, practicing what Jesus taught. I urge you to make the effort to travel if needed and be together with your family and loved ones if at all possible, as often as finances permit. This embodies what Christmas means to me and will likely be what means the most to you and your loved ones as time moves forward. I would love to be in church with you every Sunday, but just know I am there in spirit. I have my

memories of many of you which I draw happiness and comfort from daily. I appreciate very much all of you who write and have visited and who have sent pictures and updates from your lives and the events at the church. I hope there are wonderful Christmas programs and celebrations, and I would love to get an account of the celebrations. Have a very Merry Christmas and a happy new year! Richard Brooks. (Dr Brooks was a long time servant of our church, serving as an interim pastor, but also as a child of God who kept serving. He is 105 years old.)
