1st Sunday in Lent

22nd of February 2026

Lent has begun, a season of 40 days. It is a time of prayer and fasting. Traditionally people have opted to “give-up” something — alcohol, eating meat, chocolate, but recently Christians have been “taking-up” something and building new habits. They will volunteer at local soup kitchens, food banks, or other ministries of the church. They may set aside time for scripture reading or prayer. I hope you find someway to observe Lent. I promise you it can change your life. Remember, that Sundays are not considered part of the Lenten season. Sundays are days of feasting and celebration, not fasting. You are free to break your fast on those days, but most don’t, because once you have given up something it is just harder to pick it back up and then start again. The liturgical color is purple, though the 4th Sunday in Lent is known as “Laetare” Sunday, ‘laetare’ simply is Latin for “rejoice”. On that day we will switch colors to pink -- it is simply a brief pause to give thanks for God’s grace. Our sermon series is called, “7 Last Words”. We will take each of the seven last words Jesus spoke from the cross and match them to a scripture and lesson. This Sunday we are focusing on Jesus’ rather radical promise he gave to the thief on the cross: “Today, you will be with me in Paradise.” There’s a whole lot to unpack there, and his promise challenges a lot of our assumptions about heaven and hell and salvation. A story from Genesis will help guide us. Though she’s a rather minor character that hardly gets any notice, her life is a remarkable commentary on the grace and love of God. We will be adding two liturgies for Lent, an opening candle ritual composed by Pam Steinke and then a confessional liturgy before communion. This Sunday the Jubilee Ringers will be offering two special sets of music to open this season of Lent, and the choir is hurriedly working on their cantata — there wasn’t much of a break between Christmas and Easter, so keep them in your prayers. Be sure and plan to participate in Holy Week — Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunrise.

Widow(er)s Support Group

Our support group for Widow(er)s meets at the church library at **Noon** on the **first and third Wednesdays** of each month. If you grieve, you don't have to grieve alone. This is such a loving, encouraging, and supportive group of people. You will feel welcome and cared for. There are occasional luncheon outings, particularly on the 5th Wednesdays of months.

Parkinson's Disease Support Group

Shower & Laundry Ministry

Our church showers are open to men and women so they can freshen up, do a load of laundry, and be ready for a job interview, medical appointment, or just a chance to be clean. Showers are available **Monday and Wednesdays, 9 AM till 1:00 PM**. Volunteers are needed, flexible scheduling.
