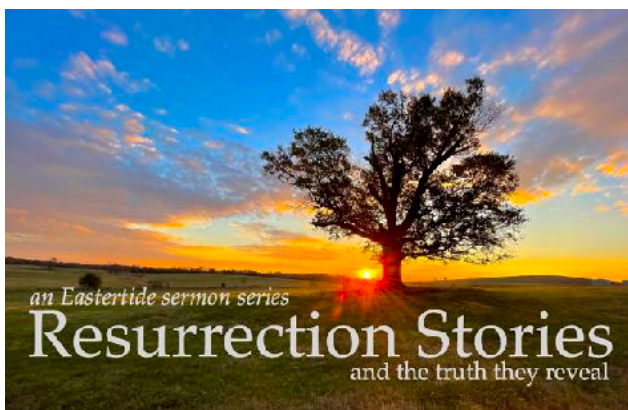

the Fifty Days of Eastertide

25th of May 2025

This is **Memorial Day Weekend**, our little community will be busy with tourists as this marks the first day of Summer vacation for many around our nation. Traffic will be busy and the restaurants full. But, let us not forget what this day represents: for throughout our history there are many who gave the last full measure that we might be free. This is a time to remember those who died serving our nation, from the Revolutionary War to the Civil War, from World War II to the War on Terror. It is also a time to hold in our hearts the widow(er)s and orphans that were left behind. This past week we said goodbye to **James Mitchell**, a beloved member of our congregation. James' heart simply gave out, and he leaves behind a great void. Continue to hold his wife, Ruth, in your prayers, and on behalf of the family a deep appreciation to all who came to the memorial service to remember him. **Eastertide** is nearly over, and three big events on the Christian calendar will come one right after another — **Ascension Sunday**, **Pentecost Sunday**, and **Trinity Sunday**. Trinity Sunday will mark the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, a watershed moment in our history that defined

the doctrine of the Trinity and wedded secular power with spiritual power to create Christendom, something we are still wrestling with today. Should the church and state be separate, or should the church rule over the state? Nicaea was the first time that Christians around the empire gathered as one to settle their divisions and disagreements. Although the Trinity came out of this work, the divisions were never really settled. Christianity has always been a diverse religion, and we'll spend one or two Sundays exploring its impact on us today.
