Update on Disunity

So far only a handful of smaller churches have started the process towards disaffiliation, and only a couple of larger ones have begun that same process. Even if they garner a three fourths vote of their membership they would still need the approval of the Annual Conference. Schism is always an ugly process, and we had hoped that the long pause of the pandemic would allow cooler heads to prevail. General Conference is still two years away, so major decisions are postponed till then.

Answering the Call

We are still delivering weekly, frozen meals to those in need, and the need is increasing as inflation hits the pocketbooks of many Americans. Choices are being made between buying medicine and eating. Our next mobile pantry will be on July 13th. We hope to increase the giveaway to include 200 families, who will receive a box of fresh produce, some meat, and a box of dry goods/pantry items.
