

A special called session of the Arkansas Annual Conference met on the 19th of November to discuss and approve a slate of churches and congregations asking to disaffiliate and no longer be "United Methodists." During the last General Conference of our world-wide body, a paragraph was inserted into our governing Book of Discipline that allowed for congregations to seek a divorce from our denomination and take all physical property. This is all due to the continuing struggle over the issue of homosexuality and whether or not we will be an inclusive church. 10% of our conference churches are seeking to leave, mostly small churches led by local pastors. A few of our large churches have asked to leave, too. Two-thirds of the congregation must ask to leave. This process was to be led by the laity only, but tragically pastors have taken charge of the process. This has left many of our congregations deeply divided with friendships often broken. Our denomination is deeply broken at the moment, and our conference is hurting. I know many of these churches have sparked civil wars within their congregations. People feel betrayed and abandoned. The special Annual Conference did nothing to heal these divisions. Though most of the churches asking to leave

were approved, the three large ones were voted down. They must now start the process all over again. John Wesley taught us that though we may not all believe alike, we can certainly all love alike. The Methodist system was created to encourage that process, binding us all together under a single system (hence why all property is owned by all Methodists). Wesley meant for us to solve our differences in holy conferencing. We were never to split, but to always allow love to guide us to new ways of thinking and living together. Only once in our history did we fail to do so, and that was over the issue of slavery. We eventually healed those differences but today



many claim the issue of homosexuality is something they cannot and will not accept. This breaks my heart. I have served with many LGBTQ military members. I have dear friends who happen to be gay. For some to claim six verses of scripture is the foundation of their idea of a true church baffles me to no end. I do not know the future of United Methodism, nor of the church. People are leaving in droves, sick of the fighting, the lies, the slander, and the total disregard for love. Perhaps God will find a new way of doing church. I am thankful for this church's stance and witness. We have led the charge to truly be a place of open doors, open minds, and open hearts. I am hopeful that soon all restrictions against LGBTQ will be lifted and we can finally be the church God has wanted us to always be.
