


As we finish digging out of the ice and snow, let's pray all of this is behind us, though February and March and April (and sometimes even May) we can get snow. Remember your church those Sundays you miss, both thru your prayers and thru your giving. Our work still continues even if many of us cannot make it to church on Sundays. It is early this year, in fact, it is about the earliest it can be. If you remember your church history, the Emperor Constantine at the First Council of Nicaea decided that there should be a standard date for celebrating Easter; he came up with, "The first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring equinox." Clear as mud right? Well, hopefully Pope Francis will make some headway pinning Easter to a specific date like Christmas on December 25th. Though this may take many decades to

implement, bureaucracy and all. So, make plans for Ash Wednesday February 14th (maybe I'll add a heart to the cross of ashes on your foreheads). I know Mardi Gras is very popular around year, so keep in mind there would be no such celebrations if there was no Lent — so keep them both. During Lent we will be focusing on the Gospels of Luke and John, "Sacrificial Love", as we continue our exploration of the Bible. Easter comes at the end of March. The year is already flying by so fast. In February we are going to start a challenge: on the first Sunday of each month we are asking you to invite a friend, family member, neighbor, heck, even a stranger, to come to church with you. As Methodists part of our baptismal promise is to "witness" to our faith and church. So many people are disillusioned with church, but we believe this church has something special to offer: we are willing to live out Jesus's radical call to love one another



unconditionally. We will have our communion steward and usher training after church Sunday. We postponed the training due to the ice and snow, so if you have signed up please be here! And thank you to all who have signed up! We have such a good number of volunteers we won't have to call on you nearly so often. We are looking for people to plan and implement our LGBTQ community building events. We are trying to take the church out into the community to bring people together around dinner or a fun event. Melodye and I have been responsible for the past year's events, and let's be honest, it was mainly Melodye, but she needs your help! These have been very fun events introducing our church to people that otherwise might not know about us. They are also events that bring people together in community, and they are open to all people who wish to attend. I would like to remind you that before church starting at 9 AM we do have the coffee area open with regular/decaf, hot tea, hot cocoa, water, and sodas; and often we have breakfast desserts. Hope to see you in church.

Our church showers are open to men and women so they can freshen up, do some laundry, and be ready for that job interview, or just a chance to be clean. Showers are available Monday thru Thursday from 9 AM till 1:30 PM.

We also accept cold weather clothing donations, boots, shoes, charcoal, can openers, chapstick, and non-perishable food that can be prepared over a campfire or on a grill. Donations accepted at the church office.

Bible Debrief continues on the this Wednesday in the **church library at 6 pm**. We are covering the gospels, particularly Mark's Gospel.

The Mobile Food Pantry serves Carroll County residents in need of food staples on the **second and fourth Wednesdays of every month.** Cars start lining up as early as 8:30 a.m. We provide food staples until the food runs out, often within the first hour. Friends and neighbors can pick up for friends or neighbors who do not have transportation.

Cold & Flu season is upon us, as well as an uptick in COVID cases. Please take measures to keep yourself and others safe, including wearing a mask, sitting at a distance, or staying home if you are coughing or have other symptoms. Thank you.

Thank you to Sue and Sam Ewan and friend Astrid who initiated and executed this clothing drive in conjunction with our Mobile Food Pantry. This was particularly targeted for clothes suitable for job interviews and events like funerals and weddings where certain attire is preferred. They had a great turnout and many economically disadvantaged were blessed. Thank you Sue, Sam and Astrid for putting this all together. It was such a success that they plan to hold a second event later in the year.
