

Columbarium: We announced last Sunday the church is moving forward with purchasing a columbarium to be placed in the prayer garden here in front of the church. It will have 48 niches, each niche can hold two urns. It is gray marble with black marble as the cover over each niche. Names will be engraved along with birth and death dates on the black marble, which makes it easily seen from the parking lot. We are preselling these niches for \$1200. Couples being interred together only need to pay the \$1200 if they are sharing a niche. If later you or your family decide that this is not where your remains will be placed, then the church will purchase back the niche at 70% of the original cost (\$840). You may call the office for further details or to pick up an application. We are surprised by the number of people interested so please, if you are, consider purchasing a niche. We are looking at summer for this to be available. Choir Cantata "A Weary World Rejoices" will be performed the third Sunday of Advent, December 14th. They have been

working very hard on this production and it will be a part of our worship service so invite people to enjoy this wonderful program. Blue Christmas: The holidays are not always the most joyous time of the year, and on Friday, December 19th we open our doors for a more somber and reflective Christmas observance. If you are feeling a little "blue" this season or know of someone, consider joining us that evening at 6 PM. Christmas Eve Candlelight & Communion will be at 5:30 Christmas Eve night.
