I'm back! It was good to have some time away to visit with far-flung family members and experience different cultures. It makes you appreciate what is good about America and also what we need to work to improve. One of my distant-distant nephews just graduated college in New Zealand, but being from Fiji I asked him which nation he liked better. He was very positive and had good things to say about both, and he never mentioned a negative aspect about either country. After some pondering he said, "Well, I guess New Zealand would be my favorite if I could gather up all my family from Fiji and bring them here." I can't think of many young people that would rate the importance of family so high. Our culture eschews family and community in favor of the rugged individual. Then with our preoccupation with television and other mindless pursuits we often neglect opportunities to be in community with one another. We once sat on our front porches and talked to our neighbors, now we drive into the garage and shut the door. "Busy" is another bugaboo that keeps us from relationships. Americans don't have time for anything, infected by that mythical Protestant Work Ethic that continually harps on us that we better stay busy. America, in the last fifty years, has lost its sense of community and belonging. It's not just churches struggling with declining attendance, it's also every civic organization, including volunteer fire departments. We are so busy that we can't be bothered to be neighborly. At its heart that Christian faith is that of community and belonging. There is no such thing as the solo Christians. We are called to be brothers and sisters; we are called to be in community with one another. My nephew? Fresh out of college, the whole world in front of him, and yet what is most important to him is family. We could learn a lot from his example. Don't get so caught up in our day to day lives that we forget to be in community. Visit your parents, your children. Take time to have time with your friends. Attend church and build relationships, not networks. There is more to life than status and money. In the end, we are all just walking each other home. Studies show the secret to a long life is in our relationships. The fabled blue-zone diets? At their heart is the simple equation that even in old age they have kept and maintained life-long relationships. In our bitterly divided world we need more community, we need relationships to be made a priority. Jesus told us to love one another. We can't do that while locked away in 'busyness'.

Our church showers are open to men and women so they can freshen up, do a load of laundry, and be ready for a job interview, medical appointment, or just a chance to be clean. Showers are available **Monday thru Thursday from 9 AM till 1:30 PM.**

Pantry Current needs: Food staples, ingredients to make nutrient-dense meals; refried beans, peanut butter & crackers, granola-type bars (the soft kind because they often have dental issues), moisturizer lotion, men & women sturdy sneakers/hiking boots. Donations can be dropped off at the church. **We are looking for volunteers to come in once a week to give the showers a good cleaning.**

Mobile Food Pantry

The Mobile Food Pantry serves Carroll County residents in need of food staples. Our **next pick-up date is Wednesday, July 24, 8:30 AM.** We deliver food items on a very limited basis, only to those with no transportation or someone to pick up for them. Deadline for delivery requests is Noon on Tuesdays so that the schedule can be finalized & disbursed to volunteer drivers.
