

Our liturgy today is an Easter liturgy, for it finds all of its meaning in the Resurrection. Because Jesus was raised from the dead we know that we too, shall be raised. Our service is therefore characterized by joy, in the certainty that neither 'death nor life, nor angels or principalities, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all of creation will ever be able to separate us from the love we have found in Christ Jesus. This joy, however, does not make our grief unChristian; the very love we hold for one another brings us much sorrow when we are parted by death. Jesus too, wept at the grave of his friend. Today we gather to share in our grief and gratitude to the lives God has shared with us. We give thanks for all of them who have made us who we are this day — teachers and preachers, grandparents, aunts and uncles, mothers and fathers, siblings and friends. We light votives as a symbol of our prayers, the thanksgiving of our hearts, and the pain we still carry in our spirits over the grief we still have. All Saints Sunday is that time of the Christian year we set aside to remember the honored dead. A list of names will be read of those who have died since the last All Saints Sunday. As their names are read a bell will toll and a candle placed in the baptismal font where all of our journeys began. Then, during Holy Communion, you may come and place votive candles along our altar table to remember those special



people in your life that you are grateful for having had. All Saints is one of our oldest traditions in the church. Remembering our ancestors is a near universal ritual across cultures and religions. Our prayer is that this service helps you to sit with your grief and know that you are never alone. If you are watching from home, we encourage you to gather votives of your own and join us in this time of remembrance. As Linda Hogan reminds us so beautifully, "Suddenly all my ancestors are behind me. Be still, they say. Watch and listen. You are the result of the love of thousands." We are indeed, and this day we honor and remember them. Thanks be to God.
