


It is the day of Pentecost! The moment the Holy Spirit descended upon a frightened band of confused followers, transforming them into a powerful movement that would change the world. Inspired by the breath of God they are 're-created', and one of the first amazing signs of this new power was their ability to speak in many different languages. Whereas in the beginning humanity was divided and scattered by the curse of Babel, here, the Spirit overcomes divisions and unites the people as one. God's love transcending our petty tribal divisions so that we can be one people. It's been over two thousand years since that initial outpouring of the Holy Spirit, but we have witnessed it time and time again when God's people are able to open their hearts and let the Spirit move them. The Holy Spirit unites, not divides; it fills hearts with love, not with fear. I think once more far too many churches are huddling behind locked doors, fearful of a world and culture they do not understand. Fear leads to anger, and anger leads to hate, and once more we divide the world between 'us' and 'them'. Our LGBTQ+ family is under attack more and more; Democrats and Republicans view each other as mortal enemies, and each day someone creates new divisions. This should not be our story. We are a people of the Spirit working to bring God's love to all. In all the ways we can we should work towards justice and reconciliation. We should overcome fear with God's gift of love. On that first Pentecost we like to think the church was born, but that is not exactly true. What came into being thru the Holy Spirit that day was a movement that ran counter to what the world was offering. Instead of division, they offered unity; instead of fear, they offered hope; instead of apathy, offered compassion. Rough and tumble fishermen, scandalous prostitutes, hated tax collectors, and

sinners in general all became one, focusing not on what divided them but what united and defined them — God's love. Today on this Pentecost Sunday we look for a new birth of the people by water and the Spirit. Denominations are fading away, churches are closing, and God seems to be doing a new thing. So let us throw open the doors behind which we hide in fear so that we too may catch the Spirit and be a part of this new thing God is doing. New expressions of the faith and the church are emerging! God is breathing new life into these dry bones, and we are being sent forth to overcome the world's divisions so that all may know they are God's children, loved and redeemed by Jesus Christ.
